## Autism 200 Series

The Alaska Autism Resource Center (AARC) and the Special Education Service Agency (SESA) are pleased to be your connection to this lecture series. Faculty from Seattle Children's and the University of Washington and community providers teach the classes.

There are three (3) ways to participate:

### **Outside of Anchorage/Fairbanks areas:**

#### **To connect via *videoconferencing*:**

Access to videoconferencing equipment, such as Polycom, and to an Internet connection should be arranged. (SESA uses GCI's SchoolAccess, using a router to connect to a partial T1 line). Many rural school districts have this type of equipment, as do some other sites. Please follow your district or agency procedures to schedule the video conference with your service provider and tech staff.

#### **To connect via *teleconferencing thru AARC*:**

Participants may also teleconference in by dialing 1-800-315-6338. Enter 2272# when prompted for the participant pin. You will need to mute your phone. There will be a limit of **ten (10)** telephone connections. You may want to get a group together and use a speaker phone. We will begin accepting calls at 6 p.m.
